SPANISH FOR HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS CERTIFICATE

The Department of Modern Languages and Literatures hosts an interdisciplinary certificate program in Medical Spanish. Open to students in all majors and to non-degree seeking students, the program is designed to address the growing demand for Spanish-speakers in medical settings such as hospitals, doctor's offices, or homecare. Students with previous Intermediate proficiency will advance during the course of studies to, at least, the Advanced-Low level while acquiring specialized vocabulary, structures, and language pragmatics typically found in the medical field. Graduates will be able to apply their knowledge as nurses, nurse-practitioners, physicians, medical administrators, and front-office staff in medical offices. Furthermore, members of medical teams on missions in South America should find the skills gained through the certificate useful.

Admissions:

Degree-seeking students who wish to enroll in the Certificate program must submit an application, a resume documenting prior experience working in a medical or healthcare setting, and have completed 60 credit hours achieving a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher in undergraduate coursework.

Non-degree students may also apply by submitting the following:

- · A completed application
- A resume documenting prior experience working in a medical or healthcare setting
- Confirmation of 60 completed undergraduate credit hours with a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher; students with a bachelor's degree and a cumulative GPA of 2.3 or higher may petition the Program Coordinator for a waiver of the cumulative 2.5 GPA requirement
- · Transcript(s) from any other college(s) previously attended
- Bio-Demographic information, Virginia In-State Tuition Form, Nondegree course registration request
